

NATIVE

Rubus ursinus

Pacific dewberry

Low trailing vine with small black berries that provide important food for birds and other wildlife.

Thin powdery stems are round in cross-section and covered in fine small prickles.



NON-NATIVE

Rubus bifrons

Armenian/Himalayan blackberry

Robust invasive vine that creates dense impenetrable thickets. May crowd out native plants, creating a monoculture.



Thick green or red stems have 5-sided cross-section and large, sharp prickles.

NON-NATIVE

Rubus laciniatus

Cutleaf blackberry

Similar to Armenian blackberry, this invasive vine creates dense, impenetrable thickets.

Leaves are deeply incised, giving them a lacy appearance.



3 pointy leaflets. Plants grow along the ground and over other vegetation, but rarely grow above 4 feet tall.

Leaves have 3-5 leaflets (usually 5). Plants can grow up to 8 feet tall and over 100 feet long.



Stems have 5-sided cross-section and large sharp prickles.

NATIVE

Rubus leucodermis

Western blackcap raspberry

Shrubby vine with white stems and fruits that ripen to black.

Upright-to-trailing white stems are covered in large white prickles.



3-5 leaflets are pale and fuzzy on the underside. Plant is usually more upright than trailing

NATIVE

Rubus specatibils

Salmonberry

Upright shrub with bright pink flowers and yellowish-orange to red fruits.

Upright woody stems are covered with smaller woody prickles. Grows in shady damp areas.



3 pointy leaflets extend from brown stems. Pink flowers and orange fruits make this plant unique.



NATIVE

Rubus parviflorus

Thimbleberry

Upright shrub with large fuzzy leaves and soft bright-red berries.



Leaves are single, large, and fuzzy, borne on brown woody stems.



Stems are fuzzy and lacking in prickles.
