IDENTIFICATION

A somewhat succulent annual with red-spotted orange flowers with recurved spurs. Elliptic to egg-shaped alternate leaves with a sharp point and scalloped margins.



IMPACTS

Forms a dense carpet, particularly in riparian understories and shades out native plants. These annuals die by fall, leaving the soil bare and vulnerable to erosion.



MANAGEMENT

Hand pull small patches when soils are moist. Repeat annually until seed bank has been depleted. If seed capsules are present, bag and seal and dispose in trash. Other plant parts can be crushed and left on site to dry and decay. Replant with desirable species.
