



This carrot-family plant has bright green fern-like leaves; tiny white flowers in numerous small, umbrellashaped clusters. Stems are hollow green stalks with purple blotches.



IMPACTS

Acutely toxic to humans, livestock, and wildlife; call for help if poisoning is suspected. Aggressive growth, crowds out native vegetation.



MANAGEMENT

Mowing is not recommended due to toxins. For small populations, wear gloves and long sleeves to pull or dig up plants, including entire root. Wash skin after working with poison hemlock. Follow all label directions when using chemicals.
