	CLEAR Grant request: Salem Cloth Project Nature Play		
4	Salem Environmental Education and Salem Cloth Project are partnering to host free Nature Play sessions for families with children 2-5 years old. By offering guided outdoor nature play, we will not only begin to foster curiosity for the natural environment, but also a sense of stewardship within the children and parents. Nature Play will be a year-long, monthly outdoor class that is guided by instructors utilizing the Association of Fish & Wildlife Agencies' Growing Up Wild and other natural play curriculum. Sessions will be catered to preschool aged students (2-5 years old) and focused on water, soil and natural resource education. Each session will include a literature component, imaginative play and/or an instructional activity. Each activity will be designed for parents to easily replicate at home, adding natural play content to their parenting toolbox. Sessions will be broken up into 3-month blocks beginning in October 2023 and ending in September 2024. The first year will be a pilot program to assess the program implementation, success and overall design. After one year, SCP and SEE will evaluate the program and adjust as needed.
