



ENGLISH HAWTHORN

Crataegus monogyna



IDENTIFICATION

A thorny, deciduous tree, 6-30 feet tall, with lobed, mitten-like leaves, clusters of white to pink apple-blossom-like flowers. Red fruits with a single seed usually persist into winter.



IMPACTS

This plant forms dense thickets that are impassable to larger wildlife. It can outcompete native vegetation and thrive in a range of habitats from forest understory to pasture.



MANAGEMENT

Wearing gloves to protect from thorns, pull or dig out seedlings and saplings. Cutting is ineffective as stumps usually resprout. Follow label when applying chemicals. Find more information online.
