4	CLEAR Grant request: Salem Cloth Project Nature Play Salem Environmental Education and Salem Cloth Project are partnering to host free Nature Play sessions for families with children 2-5 years old. By offering guided outdoor nature play, we will not only begin to foster curiosity for the natural environment, but also a sense of stewardship within the children and parents. Nature Play will be a year-long, monthly outdoor class that is guided by instructors utilizing the Association of Fish & Wildlife Agencies' Growing Up Wild and other natural play curriculum. Each activity will be designed for parents to easily replicate at home, adding natural play content to their parenting toolbox.
